For me it could no longer be only the collection of information to be analyzed under the cold light of logical thinking, but rather the search for a line of thought that addressed my daily observations towards greater transcendence. Over the years these orcas have become my family at sea, and most likely for them, I became their friend on the beach. Although this way of thinking could be considered far from the strict scientific protocol, it feeded my internal certainty that one day would lead to a greater contribution to the world. For over a decade I filled many notebooks with the different aspects of the life of these animals, but above all we shared the sunrise and sunset of the sun and the moonlight nights playing in the seaweed or spraying in the water. These eternal instances have been sculpted in my memory, and perhaps it is thanks to these special moments that I found the answers. It takes the relationship between the mother and Bubas and turns it into a romanticism (the original Autistic boy was brought into Patagonia by both parents, and for a shorter period). But in doing this, the story of the orcs and the child is placed in the same dis-ease to which Bubas refers. Because in the heart of narrative history is the drama of paternal abandonment: on the right Tristan wears a glove that is too big for him. It is a glove that his father left behind when he came out, depriving his disabled son of a crucial resource to cling with the world. The imaginary Beto is also marked by a family tragedy. The close contact with the female orca, which Bubas called Shaka, and which lost the calf (the childhood mortality of the orca is high, often due to marine pollution), has a healing effect both on man and child. There is a brief reference to the premise that the echo-locationary noises of cetaceans affect the human brain, but fleegling science is not the problem here. The orca is known as the "bird dust", although it belongs to the dolphin family; just like man, it is a highly intelligent bee predator with the ability to act collectively and care for his relative. It is a documented fact that the connection with these imposing creatures of the sea can bring relief to those who are affected by loss or deprivation. At the same time, in learning to father the deeply withdrawn boy entrusted to him, slowly approaching him with the same calm and respect as he approaches the orca, Beto also comes out of his deep retreat from the world. If in some way the narrative of the film extends credality, more than compensates this with the pure poetry of his cinematography and the purity of his vision. Scenes where Beto rides his horse barks through the wild territory of the peninsula of Valdes, where he shows in Lola the constellations at night, and from the top of the lighthouse near his cabin, tells Tristan that from here they can see right through the world: all point to the bigger picturewe all need to see to guide us on the stormy sea of life. The sheep festival whereCommunity meets to dance the traditional songs of Gauchos has a biblical quality for it. The same beto, at the beginning of the relationship with Lola and Tristan, is incomprehensible and curmudgeonly. The first interaction he has with her is to save them abruptly to take the water to help him sew the wounds of a sea lion that he found on the beach. It is only through the tenderness of his contact with the animals that we see the inner man before. And then the child invites this tenderness (a quality that Pope Francis often refers to how a sign of Christian life) to emerge in a fully human context. We all have a deeply rooted capacity of wonder, an attention that is not only focused on the â € œœnatureâ € in a sentimental way, but also on what respect for nature teaches us about the integrity in human relations. Ultimately the film tells the story of our desire for more innocent existence, a simpler life in which human beings, at ease in the creation of God, happy with what they are granted in the desert, are more important than money or technological experience (it is not insignificant that there is no cellular signal on the peninsula!).
