Boronda was judged, condemned and arrested in San Quentin Penitencial. Crime on Friday, May 30, 1907, Bertha insisted that her husband Frank, a fireman, had visited a place of prostitution. [3] Shortly after midnight, she cut off her husband's pennis out with a razor while in bed. [1] [4] He was able to go to the barracks, which went to the side of his house, and received treatment in a hospital. [5] Mr. Boronda witnessed the judgment that he and his wife had visited the San Jose Theater, and that the attack was not provoked. [3] He claimed she was loving and had invited him to bed before the attack. [6] The theory of prosecution was that this was a deliberate planned, attack for the sake of an attack of ciames. [6] Mrs. Borond had several defenses, the main one being his complete lack of any souvenir of the night in question. [3] She claimed that she was furious with her husband and both had a discussion because she thought he was going to leave her. She admitted that she mutilated him, but did not repent.
